



Academic Results

GL assessments give an 'age standardised score', this is a score which compares the results of our children with the historic results of children from around the country. A numerical score is given with 100 being the average score. There is a band of scores with the average range being 90 – 110 with scores below 90 representing below national average and scores over 110 representing above national average, the percentages below relate to all children including those with identified additional needs, this year:

92% of our children are achieving average or above average in English and 94% in Maths

The percentage of our children achieving an age standardised score over 100 in English is 86%, and in Maths is 72%

The percentage of our children achieving an age standardised score over 110, so above average, in English is 54%, and in Maths is 39%.

The great thing about these results is that they give credence to our **philosophy** that at school children should not only become numerate and literate, but also develop a hunger for knowledge and a thirst for learning whether this is in academic areas, sports or arts. Children need to be guided to become self-learners, to think wisely, be confident, balanced and compassionate, while developing their own particular talents and abilities to the full. Such principles are best achieved in an environment that is stable, secure and safe, but at the same time one that is exciting, rich, stimulating, rewarding and fun.
