Assessments

This week the swimming assessments will be going out. This is an opportunity to see how the children are progressing and what they have been working on in swimming. Please note that we do not solely teach to pass the awards. We work on many skills to try and help the children to become good all-round swimmers and be able to pass the minimum curriculum standard of swimming 25m unaided by the time they finish year 6.

When we are assessing the swimmers, they need to be able to demonstrate the skill asked of them at the time and over several lessons in order to show they are secure in that skill. If there is a Y on their sheet, this can indicate they have shown the skill, but not consistently, or is capable of doing the skill, they just were not able to when specifically asked to do it.

Parent Questionnaire Feedback

Thank you so much to parents who took time to complete the questionnaire a few weeks ago. We have collated the data, presented to the Forfar Board and are ready to share with you our findings. It gives us an important opportunity to stop, listen, reflect and respond. As educators being reflective is an important aspect of what we need to do to make changes and improve. We are pleased to have had an overwhelmingly positive survey for both the Nursery and the Main School, displaying a very high degree of satisfaction for parents in the education and wider school services that we offer at Springmead

Parents were highly satisfied with:

Parents were less satisfied (but still relatively happy) with:

Plans to improve:

Finances - We are working closely with Forfar Education to address parent's concerns with our finance administration. We recognise that we need to improve financial transparency, communication and billing.

Holiday Club activities – Now that Nursery have moved away from Holiday Club and is running 50 weeks a year, we are planning to relook at each aspect.

Sports facilities – We are planning to provide some optional rich sporting activities and opportunities as well as an overhaul of our sporting event program.

Communication – We are currently implementing ISAMS, a comprehensive school management system that will, when fully functioning, improve our communication by removing the need for Parentmail. From ISAMS we can email directly and share reports. This weekly newsletter is your most important avenue for keeping on top of what is going on in the school – it is long as we are a busy school and it collates everything going on. We will begin each newsletter with a table of events for the half term, this will be adapted as situations change. Our new websites are under construction, these will have a clear concise diary function.

We continue to use Blossom and Tapestry to communicate class information. To contact any member of staff please email them directly with important child information. If you are unsure of any information or who to speak to email Kim in the office and she will forward it. Email addresses are <u>firstinitialsurname@springmead.com</u>. Our policy is to respond within 48 hours to your query. Ring the school between 8am to 6pm to pass on information or talk to staff. We will always ring back by the next day or please leave a message if it is urgent.
